Picasso Pets Raises More Than \$350,000 for Animal-Assisted Therapy Programs

Ronnie McBride, who has been a Therapy Team with his dog Kenzi since 2020, was recognized for his service, piling up more than 300 volunteer hours over the past 12 months. The award was named after Margaret Davis, a

long-time Hand in Paw supporter and board member, and founder of Creative Dog Training, who passed away earlier this year.
